





MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY: The third Monday of January commemorates the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., who led the fight for civil rights through nonviolent activism, protesting racial discrimination in federal and state law. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 at the age of 35, making him the youngest person to receive the honor at that time. The national holiday became law in 1983 and is observed in all 50 states, often in conjunction with a statewide Civil Rights Day.
