

TAX INFORMATION: Massachusetts allows a deduction on personal income taxes for individuals and couples who pay rent. Although New Horizons does not calculate monthly service fees in terms of proportionate costs for rent and services, a recent study of comparable area rental apartments indicates that a studio might rent for \$900 per month, a one-bedroom for \$1,200 per month, and a two-bedroom for \$1,600 per month. These estimated figures are for rent only. New Horizons' monthly service fee includes all utilities, three meals daily, housekeeping, linen service,



activities and events, and multi-disciplinary team services. A maximum \$3,000 annual rent deduction is allowed for either an individual or a married couple filing jointly (\$1,500 if married and filing separately). Residents should discuss all tax matters with a professional before determining deductions.
